2. Recent Club Events:

2.1 St Michaels Masters Regatta – Saturday, September 4th at the club.

Our Masters Regatta was held for the fourth time after a one year hiatus during Covid 19 restrictions. We welcomed 23 visiting clubs who raced in 25 races over 5 hours in the city centre. There was a significant increase in recreational crew entries which was great to see, and several of the SMRC recreational crews picked up their first medal. The mixed events (male and female rowers in the same crew) are proving more and more popular, and we hope to further increase participation in 2022.

The regatta was successfully run by Richie, Mike, and Kev. As well as bringing in funds for the club, it has been established as a great social event with very positive feedback from the crews. We'd like to extend a huge thanks to all our volunteers, the Spelmans for catering the event, Hook & Ladder for the coffee van and to Limerick Council for use of the parking area beside the club.


Did you know? Did you know? Masters Rowing is for adults over the age of 26 and crew categories are calculated using the average age of a crew.

2.2 Girls Squad Surfing Trip. Saturday, October 17th Lahinch, Co. Clare.

The Junior Women's squad travelled to Lahinch in Co Clare for a crew building and social day out at Ben's Surf School. Thanks to Coach Shane for organising a great day out.



2.3 St Michaels Head of the River. Saturday October 9th at O'Briensbridge.



Our Head of the River was traditionally run in November over the 3.1km course from Castleconnell to O'Briensbridge. Increased entries made it the biggest Head of the River of the season. However, successive years of flooding, fog and poor lighting had made it increasingly difficult to run effectively. Consequently, we switched to a spring date and even though we ran several races before flooding became the issue, over recent years we have realigned our events into two different Heads of the River.

Our rolling HOR took place on October 9th at O'Brien's Bridge and our city HOR is scheduled for March 12th, 2022. 189 crews from 12 clubs raced at our October event with the fastest crew home being Castelconnell's Men's Junior 18 8+ in 10:37.9, followed closely by our own Men's Junior 18 8+ in 2nd place in 10:41.1. We had several top three placings at the event, with wins in the following categories listed below. Well done to our Recreational crews who also competed in the 4x+ and the 2x+. It is great to see them competing for the club at so many events.

Did you know? Rolling Head of the Rivers are run during the winter & are time trial events when crews can race at any time & the times are ranked once all racing is completed to find the fastest crews. Winning crews are awarded Pennants rather than medals. Check out the hundreds of Pennants hanging from the rafters of the clubhouse next time you are down at the club.

2.4 Weather Effects Training – Plan B!

We are always up against it with the Irish winter weather but it's great that we are quick to adapt and create alternatives. Recent challenging weather has led the squads to the peak of Moylussa in Co Clare, a very competitive game of rounders in Ted Russell Park, long distance runs in Cratloe as well as sessions in UL's rowing tank. 2.5 Provincial Indoor Rowing Championships – November 20th at UL Arena

Over 70 juniors as well as our Rec rowers took part in the Provincial Indoor Champs in UL, run by RowFit. Some great racing took place which bodes well for the Indoor Champs in January. Our Junior 16/18 squads travelled north to compete in Erne HOR 4's races. The squads stayed overnight on Friday night with coaches Shane, Len & Stuart travelling with the squads. Huge thanks to parents Michelle McDonagh & Brian McInerney for travelling to help with the crews & finally to Ado Cunningham for towing the trailer from Limerick to Enniskillen and back again, great job St Michaels!

Erne HOR 4's racing was completed over 2 races (Women's race at 10:30am & Men's race at 1:00pm to allow for boats to be used twice) with over 70 crews racing. Our WJ18 4+ placed 3rd in a time of 22:03.1, 15 seconds off winners Enniskillen. Our MJ18 4x- placed 2nd in a time of 18:25.3 just 5 seconds off St Josephs. Positive results for the early season racing.

We had a great day in the club as we welcomed two- time World Champion, two- time European Champion and three-time Olympian Sanita Puspure. Sanita met with our junior squads, spending time coaching on the water and taking questions during Q&A sessions. Huge thanks to Captain Mike for organising and of course to Sanita for her time, knowledge and energy during her day with St Michaels.




2.8 SMRC.ie Revamp
